

Jay Franson moved that the Council approve the reappointment of Merlin Larsen to the Planning Commission for a term to expire February, 1989. Motion was seconded by Rick Westwood. Motion passed by unanimous vote.

16. Speed Limit Change in American Fork

Jay Haws noted he had not received a response to his letter requesting justification for the reduction in speed in American Fork on First East. He noted that he called the State Department of Transportation and Skip Anderson and they reported that the reduction in speed is an experiment. Jay indicated that they did not have a speed survey, but the speed limit was lowered due to the pressure put on by the police chief. Jay will follow up on the matter with American Fork City.

17. February 12 Minutes

The Council determined to wait to approve the February 12 minutes in the March 12 meeting.

18. American Fork Library Usage

Mayor Miller noted he had reviewed the recommendations and study made by Dorothy Blomquist on Highland City's use of the American Fork Library. Her recommendation was the same as American Fork's that Highland pay for our residents' library usage out of the city budget. Mayor Miller indicated that he did not feel the \$20,000 recommended was a reasonable price and that it was more than the \$20 now required by Highland residents per family. Rick Westwood stated that if the citizens feel \$20 per family is too much, then he didn't feel it should be taken out of the city budget. He noted that library cards can be obtained on a quarterly basis. Angie Hooton noted the availability of the Bookmobile, as well as the Lehi Library. She noted that Lehi charges \$10 per family.

19. Adventure and Learning Park

Mayor Miller reported that the American Fork Training School is no longer able to fund the Adventure and Learning Park. The County Commissioners have indicated willingness to put the maintenance into their budget, but they would like either American Fork or Highland to run it. Mayor Evans of American Fork does not want to annex the Park into American Fork. Commissioner Bob Warnick indicated that Mountainlands have some CETA funds and he suggested looking into this for use in maintaining the park. The Mayor expressed concerns for law enforcement problems and an eye soar if the park is not maintained.
